By Air

Barcelona Airport is located south-west of the city of Barcelona. It is just 3 km from the Port of Barcelona, one of the most important ports in the Mediterranean for container traffic and the leader in the cruise market. It is also located near the Free Zone Consortium, one of the most important industrial and logistics centres in Spain.

Barcelona Airport constitutes a cornerstone of the Catalan economy and is particularly important for the business sector and tourism industry. To modernise and prepare Barcelona Airport for future air traffic demands, major improvements to infrastructure and services are currently being conducted. The Barcelona Plan will transform the airport. This is the third major transformation operation for Barcelona Airport. It includes the modernisation of the existing facilities, the construction of a third runway, a new terminal area, new road and railway accesses and the urbanisation of over 300 hectares as a service area for the industrial and commercial development of the airport.



By Train

Barcelona is also an important railway link, connected favourably with the rest of Spain and with Europe which constitutes an advantageous link in the intermodal transport chain with regard to obtaining the greatest efficiency at a low cost.

With regard to Spain, Barcelona is connected daily with trains of the catalan Express network to and from Girona, Tarragona, Lleida and the most important cities in the belt of the catalan capital.

Barcelona is also perfectly connected with Castellón, Valencia and Alicante with the Euromed (high speed train for the mediteranean corridor), and with Zaragoza and Madrid with the Talgo VII and Hotel train (travelling by night).

By Sea

Barcelona has become the Mediterranean's foremost cruise ship harbour. It has eight passenger terminals, five for cruise liners and three for ferries. It operates services to the Balearic Islands and the main Mediterranean ports. Ferries depart daily for the Balearic Islands and there is a direct service to the port of Genoa.

Barcelona harbour has direct connections and operates regular passenger and vehicle transport services to the Balearic Islands, Genoa, Rome and Algiers-Oran.

Three companies operate between Barcelona and the Balearic Islands: Trasmediterranea, Iscomar and Balearia.

Barcelona is one of the main cruise harbours in the Mediterranean and is establishing its position as the base port for cruise companies. Actually is the 1st European cruise and the 10th World one.



Ground Transportation within the city

Public Transportation:

The city has a convenient and efficient public transport network (buses, metro, tram and suburban rail) which was used by almost 887 million people in 2005. The cost of public transport is much cheaper in Barcelona in comparison with other European cities.

• Metro:

Barcelona currently has six metro lines covering a total of 87 kilometres and passing through 123 stations.

• Bus:

Barcelona Metropolitan Transport (TMB) operates a fleet of over 1.000 buses, 70% of which are adapted for people with reduced mobility.

• Ferrocarrils de la Generalitat-FGC:

The Ferrocarrils de la Generalitat-FGC, run by the Catalan government, supplements the metro network with a city railway network.

• Tram:

Barcelona tramway system, known as the Tram, was relaunched in 2004. This means of transport, which was abolished in 1971, is now an accessible, environmentally friendly, fast and confortable system. It consist of two sections; the Diagonal Baix Llobregat and the Ciutadella-Besos.

• Train:

Barcelona has also an extensive network of commuter trains, operated by RENFE the Spanish National Railway Company, which depart from main stations every five of ten minutes. The train's ability provides comfortable and rapid access to the city centre from the outskirts of the city.

• New Projects:


A new metro line is under construction that will link the city with the airport. It will be operating in the year 2011.

Taxis

Barcelona has 11,000 taxis, which are easily identified by their yellow and black colour. They have a clearly visible green light on their roof which, when lit, indicates that they are available. A ride from the airport to the city centre costs approximately 20 €.

This taxi service has professional bilingual drivers with top-quality. It also has seven-seater vehicles suitable for small groups of tourists or business people which offer more economical rates per person. There is also a fleet of taxis which can be adapted to carry people with disabilities (on request).

Social Functions



Event Venues in Barcelona

Barcelona has been able to preserve the best architecture of its past, while building new architecture characteristic of each era. This is why it can now offer matchless range of venues. From a Royal Palace set among romantic gardens, to the exquisite, rationalist pavilion designed by Mies Van der Rohe; from the Liceu Opera House and Palau de la Música concert hall, in the heart of the city, to a stately country house on the city's outskirts. Barcelona offers these and many more unusual spaces, as well as the usual conference centres, hotels and restaurants, which can host receptions, banquets and parties from small groups to several thousands.

We describe hereunder some of them, but full information can be obtained from the Barcelona Convention Bureau.

Casa Milà – La Pedrera



An emblematic work by Antoni Gaudí built between 1906 and 1912. At present it is the headquarters of the Caixa de Catalun-ya Cultural Centre. The building's Auditorium and Sala Gaudí have all the facilities for symposiums, conferences and other events.

Casa Llotja de Mar



A neoclassical building of medieval origin. Has various halls for events held by the Chamber of Commerce. Outstanding large Gothic hall which is used mainly for banquets.

Estació de França



The recently refurbished old railway station. A landmark in the city which offers its vestibule and platforms to provide a unique and distinctive setting.

Fundació Joan Miró



Houses the most broadly-based collection of Joan Miró's work. It is also a study centre for contemporary art and stages exhibitions by artists from around the world. Due to its prime location, overlooking the city from the vantage point of Montjuïc, the Foundation is also a point where leisure and culture converge and offers a wide and varied range of spaces for private and business events.

Gran Teatre del Liceu



The theatre opened in 1847 and its architecture and decor reflected the sumptuous taste of European theatres of this type. Destroyed by fire in January 1994, it was rebuilt and finally reopened in October 1999. Today it is one of Barcelona's landmark buildings and a key element in the city's cultural heritage. It has two different area: El Saló del Miralls and the Foyer.

L'Hivernacle

Iron and glass greenhouse building, situated in the Ciutadella Park. By Josep Amargós, 1884. Used for cultural events, exhibitions and receptions or banquets

Masia Bach

The Bach wineries are located in Sant Esteve de Sesrovires, in the heart of the Penedès region. This stately mansion, typical of the 1920s, has been declared a listed building by the Generalitat de Catalunya, as it is one of the finest examples of the noucentista style of the period. Produces cavas and wines.

Museu d'Art Contemporani de Barcelona - MACBA

Set in the heart of Barcelona, the MACBA building is a project designed in a rationalist style by the American architect Richard Meier. It stands out due to its light interior and wide spaces which create a permanent dialogue between the interior and exterior of the Museum through large windows and skylights.

Museu de Zoologia (Sala de la Balena)

This modernist building stands at one of the gates to the Ciutadella Park. Built as a café restaurant for the 1888 Universal Exhibition. Events and receptions are held in the Sala de la Balena, which contains an impressive, 15-metre-long whale skeleton.

Palau Güell

Built by Antoni Gaudí as a commission from Count Eusebi Güell. The building reflects Gaudí's bold treatment of space. Inside there is an extraordinary wealth of detail and the palace has recently acquired some of its original furnishings.

Pavelló Barcelona

German pavillion built by Mies van der Rohe for the 1929 International Exhibition. Recently reconstructed on its original site. Sober and exclusive.



Palau de la Música Catalana

Modernism building of great beauty designed by the architect Domènech i Montaner. In addition to the theatre proper, following recent restoration, it boasts a spacious foyer for receptions.

Parc Güell

Designed at the beginning of the century by Antonio Gaudí according to the garden-city model, it later became a public park. Park Güell has two areas where receptions can be held: the Hypostyle Room, a covered circular space featuring Doryc-style columns decorated with the most characteristic Gaudiesque ornamentation; and the esplanade, located above the Hypostyle Room, which is bounded by an undulating bench covered in multicoloured "trencadis" mosaic.

Sala Marqués de Comillas

Located in the Drassanes Reials, the medieval shipyard, which is the world's most important civic Gothic building. The Sala Marqués de Comillas is a hypostyle room which has been restored while strictly conserving its original structure and equipping the space with every service.

Teatre Nacional de Catalunya

Unique venue designed by the architect Bofill. Public events organisers have discovered and used it for a variety of events, whenever it is available. The complex comprises three theatres, spacious lobbies, gardens and all the services the public need, including a restaurant and bookshop.

Verger de l'Antic Palau Reial Major

In the heart of the Gothic Quarter, next to Barcelona Cathedral. The space is framed by a great porch which provides the alternative of a covered and open-air area.

Bell Recó

A luxurious mansion set in 4 hectares of garden which provides the opportunity to hold events of particular significance, just 20 minutes outside Barcelona. Its location, size and great artistic value make it one of Catalonia's most stately mansions. The building has modern facilities for banquets and conventions.

Can Magí

Can Magí, located just 10 minutes away from Barcelona, is a complex built in 1878 which fuses late neo-classical style and early modernisme (Catalan art nouveau).

We have 2,000 m2 of fully refurbished meeting rooms where you can hold conventions, product presentations, fashion shows, car exhibitions and cocktail receptions for between 20 and 2,000 people. Can Magi is a unique venue, located in Sant Cugat, set in 8,000m2 of lawned garden. It has parking facilities for cars and coaches.

Casa Batlló



This architectural jewel by Antoni Gaudí, is a premium venue for meetings, product presentations, banquets, congresses, cocktail receptions and gala celebrations. The meeting rooms have been perfectly restored and equipped in order to host the most prestigious and highest-standard convention, fashion show, product presentation or cocktail reception Barcelona can offer. The modular layout of its space makes it possible to host events catering for 15 to 1,500 people, including cocktail receptions or presentations.

Casa Batlló, unique, singular and exceptional. More than a building, it is a myth of the universal art and architecture of all time.

Castell de Sant Marçal

Sant Marçal castle dates back to the first half of the 12th century and is located in Cerdanyola del Vallès, just 15 minutes from Barcelona city centre. In recent years, major restoration work has been carried out on the building and its grounds to highlight the features which have been added over the years and adapting the castle's greenhouse and cellars to host all kinds of exclusive events for between 30 to 650 people. Its wonderful gardens elegant function rooms and 25.000 m² polo pitch, which can be used for open-air or marquee events, make Sant Marçal castle the ideal place which epitomises unique events.

El Tablao de Carmen

The finest pure flamenco in a unique setting: the Poble Espanyol on Montjuïc. The best combination of culture and entertainment, very near the trade-fair site. Capacity: 170 people. Topquality, typical Spanish cuisine. Light snacks, receptions and gala dinners.

Finca Mas Solers

Combines the elegance of a Catalan-Renaissance-style palace of the late 19th century with state-of-the-art facilities. The splendid gardens, the numerous meeting rooms, the open-air auditorium and La Boîte, form a top-class complex which is leader in its field.

In 1987 the Masia opened its doors, letting its rooms and gardens for the celebration of any social or professional event.



Palau Maricel

In the historical and cultural centre of the picturesque town of Sitges, 36 km from Barcelona. The rooms and terraces of this palace, overlooking the sea, are today used for numerous congresses and conventions.

La Paloma

El Principal de Tragaluz

Gaudí and the Modernism



The dynamism of the Modernist movement in the arts at the turn of the century is reflected in the architecture of the Eixample district. The Eixample, meaning "expansion", refers to the area where from 1860 onwards the city began to spread beyond the mediaeval city walls. A central sector of the Eixample is known as the Quadrat d'Or (Golden Square) because of its rich concentration of Modernist buildings. Key works by Barcelona's most internationally renowned architect Gaudí, and other leading Modernist architects are in this area. The work of Antoni Gaudí was influenced by the Modernist movement but went far beyond it. His unique style, which stemmed from providing wildly creative solutions to technical problems and an extravagant ornamentation, still causes a sensation today. Two of his most striking works are in the Passeig de Gràcia, the Casa Batlló, a dazzling example of his use of different materials and abstract forms, and furher up the Casa Milà, popularly known as La Pedrera. Gaudí's church Sagrada Familia is probably the most famous of all his works.


Olympic Barcelona

Barcelona now looks towards the sea. The 1992 Olympic Games gave the city the opportunity to redesign its seafront, which now stretches along four kilometres of beaches. To the south, Montjuïc Park is the site of the Olympic Ring and commands unbeatable views of the new seafront area. The new World Trade Centre is located in the harbour. La Rambla extends, via a walkway, over the sea to the Maremagnum, a leisure complex which houses L'Aquàrium, the biggest aquarium in Europe, and is close to the refurbished Barceloneta beaches. The Olympic Village lies south of here, by the marina. Top local architects were involved in developing the new seafront district, as well as international stars, such as Isozaki, Meier, Siza, Gehry ...



Museums

Culture is a sign of Barcelona's identity, and its museums bear this out, as they take us on a historic trail through the city's artistic output. The Museu Nacional d'Art de Catalunya has unique holdings of Romanesque and Gothic art. In the sphere of contemporary art, Barcelona has the Museu Picasso, the Fundació Miró and the Fundació Tàpies, with their splendid collections of works by these great contemporary artists who were born or worked in the city. The Barbier Muller Pre-Columbian art holdings and the Thyssen collection at the Monastery of Pedralbes; museums and exhibition centres such as the Macba and CCCB, complete a selection of works of art which can also be seen in the city's streets, with a collection of 200 recent sculptures, by artists such as Miró, Chillida, Oldenburg and Lichtenstein.








Montserrat And The Penedes

The Penedès region, also located very near Barcelona, is the area traditionally associated with producing cava –the local variety of champagne? and white and red wines. This trail ends with a tour of some of the region's oldest wineries, and with a tasting of their products.

Since it opened in 1995, it has received millions of visitors every year and has brought about an increase in the number of tourists to Catalonia. 
Towards Tarragona

The white, seaside town of Sitges rises up to the south of Barcelona and was one of the cradles of the Catalan art-nouveau movement ?modernisme? as the Museu Cau Ferrat bears out. As we continue south, we find Tarragona, the main city in southern Catalonia and the heir of Tarraco, the great Roman bastion of ancient Hispania. The traces of Roman dominion prevail in the geography of the city; amongst these we highlight the theatre, the forum, the circus and the praetorium, as well as the extraordinary collections exhibited at the Museu Nacional Arqueològic.




Catalan Romanesque

Nearly two thousand Romanesuqe buildings are scattered over Catalonia, bearing witness to the most ancient monumental art still in use today. Among these, we highlight the small churches built in the valleys of the Pyrenees, such as those of Boí, Sant Climent and Santa Maria de Taüll; or the monasteries of Ripoll, Sant Cugat and Sant Pere de Rodes. And, of course, the collections of mural paintings, frontals, codices, sculptures and other art objects preserved in the museums of Barcelona, Vic, Girona and La Seu.




The Cistercian Heritage

The counties of Tarragona have preserved three superb monasteries: Santa Maria de Poblet, Santes Creus and Santa Maria de Vallbon. All of them were founded in the 12th century by the Cisterican order. Poblet (which houses the tombs of the Catalan-Aragonese kings and queens) and Vallbona continue to operates as religious centres and have opened small guest houses, ideal for a few days retreat and rest.




The World Of Dalí

The painter Salvador Dalí created his own artistic world in Cap de Creus, the sheer, slaty coastline on the northeastern tip of the Iberian Peninsula. Dalí is the ideal focus for one of the many possible tours of the Costa Brava: here you can visit his theatre-museum in Figueres, his home in Port-Lligat or his castle in Púbol. And, of course, there is also Cadaquès, where Dalí spent the summers of his youth: a beautiful, unspoilt hideaway, which was also frequented by García Lorca, Buñuel, Éluard, Magritte, Duchamp and Man Ray.



Girona

Girona is beginning to be known as the Florence of Catalonia. The refurbishment of its river front, the restoration of the ancient Jewish Quarter, its resurgence as a university town and a painstaking and sympathetic process of urban renewal, have made the city an ideal place to live. New attractions, such as the Museu del Cinema, with its amazing collection of film equipment, co-exist with splendid monuments of which the Cathedral is the centrepiece –a compendium of Romanesque, Gothic and Baroque styles? with its Tapestry of the Creation, which shines out in a blaze of vivid colour. A short distance from Girona, on the coast, a series of charming villages await the visitor, from Tossa to L'Escala, passing through Sant Feliu, Calella, Tamariu, Begur and L'Estartit.


Seville

La Rioja


